E-Safety - Do not ignore

We have arranged a free E-Safety workshop available for all parents which will take place on **Wednesday 21st November 2018 at 15:30 in the School Hall.**

We stress the importance of a parent attending the session to provide you with a valuable strategy to keep your family safe on the internet.

Why is it important to stay safe online?

The potential for the internet to be a valuable and fun resource for entertainment, making friends and learning is huge. But if you use the internet, you could be at risk of illegal activity or abuse - be it bullying, fraud or something more serious. Unlike seeing someone face to face, on the net, people aren't always what they first seem. Placing your child's name online and a picture of them in school uniform gives away a great deal of information that others may exploit and gain access to your child.

In the same way you learn about safety when you leave the house, it is important to learn how to stay safe online. These are skills that will stay with you for life.

The fabulous aeroplanes were then collected by The Big Ideas Company that visited the school from London. This week it was announced that the Name Your Plane exhibition is now open for public viewing at RAF Hendon, London. Our planes are included in the 4,805 planes decorated by school and community groups all across the United Kingdom and are exhibited in the First World War hanger of the museum and will be open to the public until **20 November 2018**.
