












Is your child starting school in September 2019? Visit https://www.lincolnshire.gov.uk/schools-and-education/schooladmissions/ to apply for a place.

# E-Safety -Talking to your child

#### It is really important to chat with your children on an ongoing basis about staying safe online. Not sure where to begin? These conversation starter

#### suggestions can help.

- 1. Ask your children to tell you about the sites they like to visit and what they enjoy doing online.
- 2. Ask them about how they stay safe online. What tips do they have for you, and where did they learn them? What is OK and not OK to share?
- 3. Ask them if they know where to go for help, where to find the safety advice, privacy settings and how to report or block on the services they use.
- 4. Encourage them to help someone! Perhaps they can show you how to do something better online or they might have a friend who would benefit from their help and support.
- Think about how you each use the internet. What more 5. could you do to use the internet together? Are there activities that you could enjoy as a family?
