## Online Payment System

Due to parental requests, the school are currently having meetings with companies who provide online payment systems for schools. This would allow the school to move towards a cash and cheque free school, and allow for parents to make easy payments from a device of their choice. Once the Governors have selected a system, we will provide you with more details.

## School Uniform

You will by now have had the opportunity to see our new school uniform and we wanted to thank you for the orders that we have received and we would like to update you with some of the actions we have taken based on the feedback that we have received. As many of you will know, this process initially started in May 2019 when we invited our pupils, their parents and grandparents to think of a school motto for the school. It was decided that our motto would be 'Courage, Perseverance and Success'. Over the December 2019 Christmas holidays, we ran a competition for the children to redesign our school badge to reflect the motto.

Over the last few years, we have received feedback from parents about the school sweatshirts/cardigans - fading, fraying at the cuffs, having a neck collar that is too small and the cardigans being shapeless. So, when changing the badge, we also took the opportunity to source a good quality jumper/cardigan and change some of the other items to rebrand the uniform.

Quality and cost has been a high priority and we would like to make parents aware of the following in case it was not clear in the correspondence.

Parents are able to buy alternative non-branded uniforms from supermarkets and high street shops - navy jumpers and cardigans, plain white polo shirts and plain white PE

shirts. There is also the option of a navy skirt, navy pinafore and plain navy fleece.

All pupils are able to wear grey trousers or grey shorts, blue skirts or blue pinafores.

New Foundation Stage children may wish to wear a shirt and tie, but can wear a polo shirt all year round.

Our supplier is a local company and provides uniform to many local primary schools. We compared the products with other companies but felt the quality of the products offered with this provider was better.

We are having a transition year and pupils can wear the existing branded uniform until September 2022. School will only be selling new uniform.

We will always consider any requests on alteration of uniform for SEND children, those with sensory needs or for adjustments on religious and cultural grounds.

Some of our parents have requested the option of a clip on tie. Our supplier can provide this and they will be available for you to order shortly. They are slightly more expensive, but the same price as those provided for local schools. We will also take the option of a navy polo shirt for the Summer uniform to the governors for consideration at the next meeting.

We have taken on board all the feedback we have had to date but please feel free to provide any further comments for consideration by the school using the school office email address. This on-going dialogue with you regarding the new school uniform is to ensure we are consulting fully with parents and carers regarding the changes to the school uniform.

## Supply MSAs Required

Our School requires Supply Midday Supervising Assistants (MSA) to cover sickness and absence of current staff. The role will be for 1.5 hours on the days required: 11.45am to 1.15pm.

The successful candidate must be willing to help within the hall for lunches, including setting up the hall with tables and chairs, cleaning equipment, managing waste collection and supervising the children. The role will also include outside play duties involving supervising the children, structuring and arranging games and play activities for the children across the school.

Patience and good behaviour management skills are essential, along with a good sense of humour.

You will be supported by colleagues who are enthusiastic about their contribution to pupil development and table manners.

The appointment will be subject to both a full D.B.S. clearance and reference checks. Knowledge of Safeguarding and Child Protection would be an advantage, and training will be provided by the School.
