New Phonics Scheme- Essential Letters and Sounds

This term the school has adopted a new Phonics scheme called Essential Letters and Sounds. It is a Systematic Synthetic Phonics (SSP)

programme, validated by the Department for Education. The scheme is a whole school approach to teaching, but will be predominately taught from the first days of Foundation Stage and throughout Year One. We have invested in new and exciting reading books which are closely matched only to the sounds as they are taught. Foundation Stage and Year One children will shortly be bringing home two fully decodable books each week, matched to the phonics taught that week and two books to read with the support of an adult.
