Timings of the School Day

Following our consultation with parents concerning the timings of the school day, we are pleased to announce that the Governors have formally adopted the new timings to meet the requirements set out by the Governments White Paper.

From September 2023, the new School timings will be:

Proposed New Timings	
Infants 08:50 - 15:20	6hrs 30mins
Juniors 08:50 - 15:20	6hrs 30mins

The School gates will still be open from 08:40am allowing children to make their way to their classrooms for lessons to begin at 08:50am.

At the end of the day, children will be brought to the front of school with timings slightly staggered. Foundation and Key Stage One children will brought out closer to 15:20, whilst in Key Stage 2, 15:20 is when lessons end and therefore, children will be out a few minutes after this point. Additionally, sometimes unforeseen things happen in class which result in the children coming out a few minutes later. Thank you for your understanding.

Speaking to Class Teachers

If you wish to speak with your class teacher please make an appointment either by emailing or telephoning the school office, or see the member of staff at the gates at the end of the day.

Road Safety

A reminder to please take more care driving in and around the school area. Please remember there is a 5mph speed limit on the drive.

Parking in and around school is often congested at drop off and collection times, as are most schools around England. I ask all parents to consider where you park when dropping off and collecting your children. Yes, you may think you are parked sensibly and your car is not in the way or 'not harming anyone' where it is, but can children cross safely where you have parked? Will your car make it difficult for other cars to get past?

Please spare a thought for all the local residents living around the school perimeter, especially in Cherry Tree Crescent, Baghdad Road, Delhi Square and the Costcutter car park.

Please can we show full consideration and ensure we do not park on, or obstruct any driveways or paths. School are aware of Lincolnshire Police's visits to these areas and are warning parents they are issuing tickets where appropriate.

Online Safety

Thank you to the parents who attended our free Online Safety workshop on Wednesday 19th April 2023.

The evening certainly provided you with valuable strategies to keep your family safe on the internet.

The workshop covered the following topics:

Percentages of children accessing online media in various age brackets, which included data of:

The percentage of children watching video platforms such as Youtube.

92% of 3-4 year olds

93% of 5-7 year olds

96% of 8-11 year olds

The percentage of children using Social Media Apps such as Whatsapp/Facebook.

30% of 5-7 year olds

63% of 8-11 year olds

The percentage of children live streaming their own videos

13% of 8-11 year olds

Discussions also took place around:

- Behaviours online linked to safeguarding, the technology available, and the concern of little or no age verification on apps or sites.
- Sites and apps being Algorithm driven meaning that children and parents may have no control over what they are seeing.
- To understand that sites/apps focus is on maximum engagement and how they use advertising
- Unkind comments and how these can managed
- Online bullying and online griefing
- Falling out in social media groups and the role of parents to manage this

Discussion took place around Gaming, including:

- Social interaction and levels of screen time, it's benefits and disadvantages. The engagement the children have with one another with online social interaction as a means of children keeping in touch and not being isolated.
- Peer pressure and the pressure to be unique, or being better at a game. The addictive need to make their skin/ avatar the 'best'
- Phishing scams
- Hacking in to accounts such as Roblox and Fortnight through Youtube
- Live streaming and the increase in apps such as Twitch and the resulting social isolation issues which may occur

Discussion took place around Youtube, including:

- Influencers
- Positives of Youtube, including the most common searched content, such as: 'How to...'

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- Content parents concern as to what the children are being exposed to.
- Restrictive modes what can be done
- Supervised experience, including: Explore (9+), Explore More (13+)
- Controlling of features via Google Accounts and managing children's online access
- Parental access to allow listings

Discussion took place around Social Media, including:

- Sharing with friends
- Messaging
- Showing off and influencing to make money
- Using Snapchat to make money

Discussion took place around the Internet Watch Foundation (IWF) including:

- Investigating illegal activity
- Self-generated images
- Online police reporting techniques

Final summary discussion took place around how important it is for children to be online, and, managed well can result in the experience not only being educational, but also socially important. Managing children's online experience is vital through:

- Talking to the children
- Learning about where children go online, and
- What they do online
- Learn what motivates your child online
- Monitor their language this can give an indication as to what they have seen or who has influenced them
- Their attitude online and whilst offline
- Being supportive how can you help?
- Monitor the apps and sites they have accessed
- Question anything you are not sure about
- Play together share some time together online
- Monitor their social media Whatsapp groups etc


