

Habitats

Last term we looked at habitats. We looked briefly at British habitats including urban, woodland, pond and coastal. Choose one of the habitats, from above, to study further or, if you wish, choose a habitat that is not listed. Can you describe what the habitat looks like? What animals and plants might live there? Perhaps you could produce a poster to describe the habitat or write a paragraph with no more than 5 sentences. You can illustrate your work if you wish.

Literacy

Choose an animal from your habitat. Can you write some sentences to describe it? Think about what it looks like, what are its features and what does it eat? Don't forget to include capital letters and full stops. You can use a computer to produce your sentences if you wish. Can you include some good connectives?

Food Chain

What is a food chain? Research what a food chain is? Choose an animal, that lives in your chosen habitat, then draw and label its food chain. Remember an arrow means 'is eaten by.' Can you produce a food chain for a human?

Please continue to read at home. Feel free to read some of your home books. Also, continue to practise counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. Count in 2s from 0 to 24 and then back to 0. Count in 5s from 0 to 60 and then back to 0. Can you count 10s from 0 to 100 and back to 0 again?

Art/Craft

Choose an animal from your chosen habitat. Can you make the animal? You could draw it, paint it, produce a collage or use recyclable objects to produce a 3D model. Be as creative as you want!
