Starjumps</li><li>3. Knee high runs</li><li>4. Hop on one leg (right leg)</li><li>5. Hop on the other leg (left leg)</li></ol> <p><b>Now, repeat 1-5 again.</b></p> <p><b>How many times can you repeat steps 1-5? Don't give up easily 😊</b></p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Maths Part 2:</b> <b><u>Data Collection and Representation</u></b></p> <p>Next, try the pictogram challenge included in the extra resources section. Interpret pictograms with scales of 2, 5 and 10</p> <p><b>Question: What do scales of 2, 5 or 10 mean?</b> <b>Clue: Each shape or picture might represent 2 or more people.</b></p> <p>So when you count, you need to take extra care. Have fun with this challenge.
