Draw a compass and then label it with North, East, South and West. Which way is clockwise and which way is anticlockwise? You can use the rhyme, 'Never, Eat, Shredded Wheat to help you remember compass points. Can you make up your own rhyme? What does a compass do?

Can you research what it is like in a Lincolnshire coastal area such as Skegness or Mablethorpe? Have a look at some pictures online. What might you find in a coastal area? How does the coast differ to Cranwell? Write a list of the things you might find at the coast.


As you know, our primary school is in Cranwell. Some of you live in the village too. Look at a map of the UK. Can you remember where Cranwell is situated?
