Ask the adults at home to explain why we remember the 8<sup>th</sup> of May 1945.




Have a go at making party hats to help you celebrate VE day or to wear on Thursday evenings when we all unite, to clap for the key workers who are helping to keep us all safe.

Will it work with carrots or parsnips?




# How to Make a Pirate Hat


Use a large rectangular piece of paper or newspaper.




2 Fold the paper in half.




Fold over the top corners so they meet in the middle.



Lift up the front flap at the bottom and fold.




Flip the paper over and repeat.
